



EXCURSION PLAN: *BIANCO*

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PURPOSE OF THE EXCURSION

- To view *Bianco* as part of the 2014 Perth Festival.

ENVIRONMENT

- Venue: The NoFit State Big Top. Ozone Reserve, Corner of Riverside Drive and Plain Street, Perth 6000
- The NoFit State Big Top is a licensed venue. Students attending as part of a school group will be given wrist bands to identify them to bar staff. Supervising teachers are advised to monitor student movements carefully within the venue.
- This is a standing room only performance that runs for 2 hours including an interval. Comfortable footwear is recommended.
- The venue is wheelchair accessible. Please call our Education Officer on 6488 8636 to make specific access arrangements for any students with special needs.

TRANSPORT

- Transport arrangements are the responsibility of the school.

- Buses can drop off in the allocated bus bays located at 1 Adelaide Terrace (under the foot bridge) and then park up in Nelson Crescent near the WACA.

STUDENTS

- This event is recommended for ages 7+. It contains curriculum links to General Capabilities, Drama, Dance, Music and Visual Arts.

- Perth International Arts Festival, performers and venue staff may lead, demonstrate, perform and present activities but will not undertake any role in a supervisory context.

- The Festival presents *Bianco* as part of the 2014 program.
- The Festival has a public liability insurance policy for \$20 million.

IDENTIFICATION OF EXCURSION PARTICIPANTS

- This is the responsibility of schools.
- School uniform or some form of easily identifiable item for each student is an option which may be considered by schools.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN
