PURPOSE OF THE EXCURSION

- To visit *Sacrilege* by Jeremy Deller as part of the 2014 Perth Festival.

ENVIRONMENT

- Venue: Supreme Court Gardens. Cnr Barrack Street & Riverside Drive, Perth 6000
- *Sacrilege* is a full scale inflatable replica of Stonehenge. The surface is 59 cm high and it has a capacity of 100 people at a time.
- Venue staff will be on site to manage the event, however, they will not be responsible for the supervision of visitors or any property left unattended.
- Visitor are advised that the following items will not be permitted on the installation – shoes, sharp objects, animals, bags. Wearing spectacles or sunglasses is not recommended.
- It is recommended that participants wear socks whilst on the installation as the surface may become hot in unshaded areas.
- Venue staff reserve the right to refuse entry or remove visitors whose behaviour is deemed inappropriate.

- Perth International Arts Festival, performers and venue staff may lead, demonstrate, perform and present activities but will not undertake any role in a supervisory context.
