- Venue: DownStairs at the Maj, His Majesty's Theatre, 825 Hay St Perth, corner of Hay and King Streets in the Perth CBD.

### **TRANSPORT**

- Transport arrangements are the responsibility of the school.

- Buses can drop off in the CAT bus stand on the south side of Hay St, west of His Majesty's Theatre and then park up alongside Synergy Parkland, May Drive in Kings Park or Nelson Crescent near the WACA.
- Schools are advised to allow adequate time for travelling to the venue, as latecomers will not be admitted until an appropriate point in the performance.

### **STUDENTS**

- This performance is recommended for ages 3 to 6, with curriculum links to General Capabilities, Drama, English and Visual Arts.
- Students will be involved in viewing a performance that is 60 minutes with no interval.
- This is an immersive theatre experience with a maximum capacity of 30 people per performance.
- If you are bringing students with special needs or intensive health care needs please contact the venue to ensure that the venue is suitable.

### **SUPERVISOR/SUPERVISORY TEAM**

- It is the responsibility of the school to develop a supervisory team that meets their specific requirements in line with the recommendations for supervision below.



- Perth International Arts Festival staff, performers and venue staff may lead, demonstrate, perform and present activities but will not undertake any role in a supervisory context.
